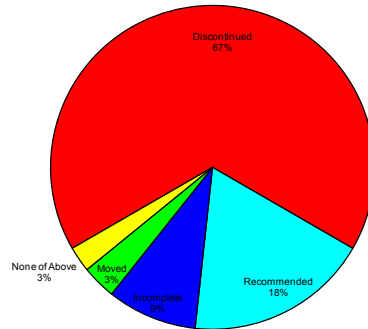




## Clemson University Reading Recovery® Training Center for South Carolina 2011-12

- For the 5<sup>th</sup> year in a row, South Carolina has exceeded the national Reading Recovery results!
- 226 teachers in 21 school systems in South Carolina taught 2,046 students in Reading Recovery.
- 152 schools participated in Reading Recovery and were supported by 15 teacher leaders and 46 teachers training in districts around the state.
- 67% of **all** children served successfully completed (discontinued) Reading Recovery on or above grade level needing no additional services. This percentage includes the children that moved during the year and did not receive a complete program and those whose programs were cut short by the end of the academic year.
- 78% of the children who received a **complete** intervention were successfully discontinued.

### Intervention Status of All Reading Recovery Students Served: Clemson University, 2011-2012



- These results were accomplished in an average of 15.4 weeks with an average of 62.5 lessons.
- 83% of the children in Reading Recovery received free or reduced lunch.
- 42% of the children were African American.
- 11% of the children were learning English as a second language.
- Reading Recovery teachers serve students in Reading Recovery for 2.5 hours a day. During the larger part of the day, they serve their schools as Title One teachers, reading teachers, special education teachers, ESL teachers, literacy coaches, and classroom teachers.
- In these other roles, Reading Recovery teachers taught **7,720 students** who directly benefited from their expertise and extensive literacy training. Compared to the traditional classroom teacher, the average Reading Recovery teacher teaches 45 students between Reading Recovery and his/her other role.
