

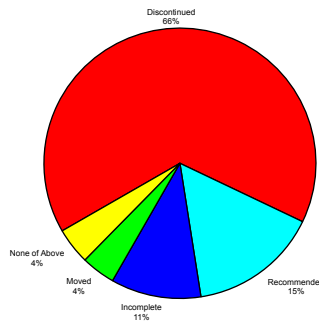


Clemson University Reading Recovery® and Early Literacy Training Center for South Carolina 2014-15

- For the 8th year in a row, South Carolina has exceeded national Reading Recovery results!
- Reading Recovery in South Carolina boasts 240 teachers, 20 Teacher Leaders, 160 schools, and 24 school systems.
- 2,069 students received the Reading Recovery intervention.
- 66% of **all** children successfully completed (discontinued) Reading Recovery on or above grade level needing no additional services. This percentage includes the children who moved during the year and did not receive a complete program and those whose programs were cut short by the end of the academic year.
- 81% of the children who received a **complete** intervention were successfully discontinued.

Intervention Status of All Reading Recovery Students Served:

- The results were accomplished in an average of 15.7 weeks with an average of 62 lessons.
- 81% of the children in Reading Recovery received free or reduced lunch; 38% of the children were African-American; 12% of the children were learning English as a second language.
- Reading Recovery teachers serve students in Reading Recovery for 2.5 hours a day. During the larger part of the day, they serve their schools as Title One teachers, reading teachers, special education teachers, ESL teachers, literacy coaches, and classroom teachers.
- Combined with their other roles, Reading Recovery teachers taught **8,483 students** who directly benefited from their expertise and extensive literacy training. Compared to the traditional classroom teacher, the average Reading Recovery teacher teaches 46 students between Reading Recovery and his/her other role.
- During the 2015-16 school year we are training 50 Reading Recovery teachers and 83 classroom teachers.
